Research Project Social Skills of Individuals With CHARGE Syndrome

We are investigating the social skills of individuals with CHARGE syndrome (CS). If you or your child has been diagnosed with CS, you may be eligible to participate.

What do I need? Ability to answer short questions using a rating scale.
