Sara Espanet, M.Ed is a Supervising Practitioner at Perkins School for the Blind, Watertown, MA, in the Deafblind School. Sara started working at Perkins School for the Blind in 2008 as a teaching assistant. In 2015 she became a classroom teacher after receiving her Masters in Severe Special Education from Bridgewater State University. Sara works with students who are deafblind and multimodal learners. Sara was a Fellow in the Sandra Davenport Fellowship Program in 2015. In 2024 Sara joined the Board of Directors of the CHARGE Syndrome Foundation.

Megan Schmittel, Ph.D, is an Assistant Professor in the Psychology Department at Westminster College in Fulton, MO. Prior to teaching at Westminster College, Megan worked as a school psychologist for Perkins School for the Blind and Jefferson City Public School District in Jefferson City, MO. In these roles, Megan co-facilitated small social skills groups and provided 1-on-1 social and emotional regulation instruction for children who are Deafblind. Megan received her doctorate degree in school psychology from Central Michigan University where she studied under Dr. Tim Hartshorne and was a member of the CHARGE Syndrome Research Lab. Megan's research interests include the development of social play in children with CHARGE syndrome, as well as the social-emotional development of individuals who are Deafblind.

Sharon Stelzer, M.Ed. is a Supervising Practitioner at Perkins School for the Blind. Sharon has been a teacher, lead teacher and a supervising practitioner in her 40 years at Perkins School for the Blind. She was a classroom teacher for students who are Deafblind for 35 years, including students with CHARGE syndrome. Sharon is active in the CHARGE and Deafblind communities as a consultant, mentor and presenter.

### Webinar: Thoughts on Behavior in CHARGE

Join the DBI CHARGE Network for a webinar on Wednesday, May 21, 2025: Thoughts on Behavior in CHARGE, with Dr. Tim Hartshorne, Professor Emeritus of Psychology, Central Michigan University.

This presentation will address Tim's thinking about behavior in CHARGE Syndrome and how it has evolved over the past 30 years. How should



we think about the challenging behavior often displayed by persons with CHARGE? Why would a person with CHARGE choose to engage in behavior which challenges parents and professionals? Tim will talk about some of the reasons for the behavior and how recognizing the communicative relationship of behavior can help us to change it. It should be noted that everyone is welcome to participate (e.g., fathers, mothers, professionals, researchers).

There will be two webinars on the same topic, at different times, so participants can choose the best time that suits their schedule. We are working with partners to provide different language interpretation. Participants will need to choose their preferred language when signing up for the webinar if your captioning has this option. (The presentation is in English).

During the webinar it is possible to ask the presenter questions.

We are pleased to offer a camp program for individuals with CHARGE and their siblings.

Corporate Kids Events (CKE) will run our onsite camp and will provide fun, entertaining activities for the kids while the adults attend conference sessions. Arts and crafts, magic shows, and petting



### **Conference Family Checklist**

Our 16th International CHARGE Syndrome Conference will be here before you know it! Here are some things you can do now, and some dates to keep in mind:



- Most families will come sometime Thursday and leave Sunday afternoon
- If you want to extend your stay, you can come in 2 days earlier and stay 2 days after Conference for the same rate of \$192.00
- You need a credit card to make a reservation

#### Registration

- Click here to register
- Register by May 31, 2025 to receive the best pricing
- Registration for individuals with CHARGE syndrome of any age is free; however they MUST register
- Other family members that will be attending Conference sessions, other Conference activities and participating in meals must register (including children 6 months and older)
- If you have any support personnel, such as nurses or interveners, traveling with you to Conference, they must also register

#### CAMP (childcare)

- Click this link to register for camp
- A separate registration is required for camp. Individuals with CHARGE syndrome of any age, and and their siblings ages 12 and under, can attend camp
- Camp is free for individuals with CHARGE syndrome of any age, but they MUST register
- There are two options for CAMP: Camp Discovery has a lower staff to camper ratio (less staff per # of campers), for siblings and more independent campers; Camp Explorer has more structure and more staff
- Caregivers can attend Camp with your child, but they must be registered for camp and for Conference



#### Sibshops

- For siblings ages 8-13
- <u>Sibshops</u> are held during the day at the same time as Conference sessions and camp
- If a sibling is attending camp, the Sibshops leaders will escort the sibling to and from camp
- A sibling may attend one half-day session of Sibshops
- You will have the opportunity to register for Sibshops when you register for Conference
- If there is enough interest, a teen Sibshop will be offered for siblings ages 14-18. The teens will gather together to share their experiences of having a sibling with CHARGE
- Junior leaders are siblings 16 years and older who will assist the Sibshops facilitators (Preference is given to siblings who have attended Sibshops at a previous Conference). <u>Click here</u> for more information and to apply to be a Junior Leader
