Ask the Expert: Creative Café: Person-Centered Scrapbook-Making

Join us for an Ask the Expert webinar entitled Creative Café: Person-Centered Scrapbook-Making with Yumi Shirai, PhD, on Monday September 8, 7-8pm EST.

Dr. Shirai is an Associate Professor at the Sonoran Center for Excellence in Disabilities at the



University of Arizona. She also serves as an affiliate faculty member with the Applied Intercultural Arts Research and Innovation in Aging programs. She holds a PhD in Family Studies and Human Development and an MA in Theater/Dance, both from the University of Arizona. Dr. Shirai's work focuses on community-based programs and research projects that use creativity and the expressive arts—such as movement, theater, and storytelling—to support a meaningful and quality of life for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Her approach is highly collaborative, engaging individuals with IDD, their families, and care providers in the sharing of knowledge and creation of innovative practices.

As co-director of the Family Medicine Residency Scholarly Project Program, Dr. Shirai mentors medical residents in their research and contributes to the Medical Humanities curriculum, helping future physicians connect more deeply with the human experience of healthcare.

The Creative Café: Person-Centered Scrapbook-Making Workshop invites individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and their caregivers to collaboratively creating a person-centered planning supplement in a scrapbook format. This arts-based workshop offers participants a meaningful outlet for self-exploration and expression, helping them capture and share their life stories—an essential step toward healthy, community-based living.

The resulting document serves as a valuable tool to strengthen community connections and relationships for individuals with IDD, while also providing caregivers with important insights to deliver more personalized, person-centered support.

In this interactive session, Dr. Shirai will guide participants through key steps and creative strategies for generating, sharing, and synthesizing personal stories. She will lead engaging activities, present real-life examples on selected topics, and offer practical guidance on how participants can adapt this scrapbook-making approach to their own areas of interest or professional contexts.
